**Our Ocean Youth Leadership Summit** Agenda 2023

**Our Ocean, Our Connection** will be the theme of this year's Our Ocean Conference. As an integral part of the Our Ocean Conference, the organizers and the Sustainable Ocean Alliance are co-hosting the sixth <u>Our Ocean Youth Leadership Summit</u>, which will take place on February 27-March 1, 2023 in Panama. Initiated by U.S Secretary John Kerry and Sustainable Ocean Alliance in 2016, the youth summit will align with the main conference theme and feature ocean solutions in one of the following areas: marine protected areas, climate change, sustainable fisheries, marine pollution, sustainable blue economy, and maritime security

This year we'll convene **the world's top 70+ ocean ideas created by youth ages 18-35 from across 45 countries**. It is an opportunity for leaders in policy, industry, research, government, ocean conservation, and NGOs to engage with the next generation of leaders, invest in youth-led ocean solutions, and inspire future generations to take action.

This refined hackathon-style approach offers youth participants to convene in small teams under the guidance of mentors to solve for key ocean challenges across impact areas. Over the course of the event, youth participants will be provided with opportunities for experiential learning, skill building, and networking.
